Analysis of MLA Job Information List--1996-7 (October, December, February)

The total number of announced openings for candidates with degrees in rhetoric and composition studies (or strong specializations in the field) appears to have increased markedly this year: approximately 197 openings this year vs. approximately 130-140 per year for the preceding 3 years.

To arrive at the figure of 197, I counted only positions that were clearly identified according to one of the following specializations or that called for extensive preparation in one of the specializations: composition, technical/professional writing, and rhetoric. I also counted a number of positions calling for an additional specialization in literary study or linguistics, but did so only when the ads clearly called for extensive work or preparation in rhetoric and composition studies. I excluded listings for generalist positions requiring only some experience teaching composition.

The figures for each of the specializations follow.

Please note that the only significant number of non-tenure-track positions comes in the composition category (27/123). The non-tenure-track positions range from short term lectureships, to continuing administrative positions with substantial salaries, to long-term and renewable appointments in non-departmental programs.

I also compared informally the positions announced in the JIL with those announced in the H-Rhetor Job List and through postings to WPA-L. I did not cover other important lists such as W-Center. I estimate that 50% of the announcements on the two lists I survey also appeared in the JIL. Thus, to get some idea of the total number of positions announced, we might combine my figure of 197 with one-half of Jeanne Fahnestock's overall count of position announcements.

*If* we look at the JIL alone, we might conclude that the market for people with doctorates emphasizing one or more of the specializations designated loosely by "rhetoric and composition studies" is indeed good. The number of positions is up. Most are tenure track. They call for many different kinds of teaching, administration, and research. And they often convey a sense of respect for the field.
